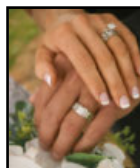

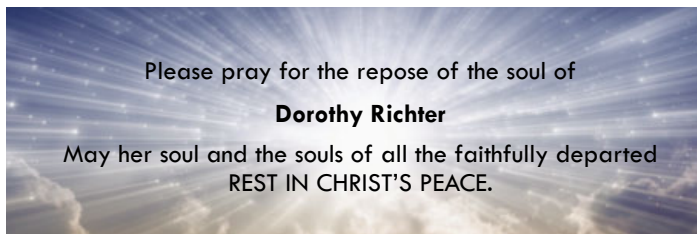

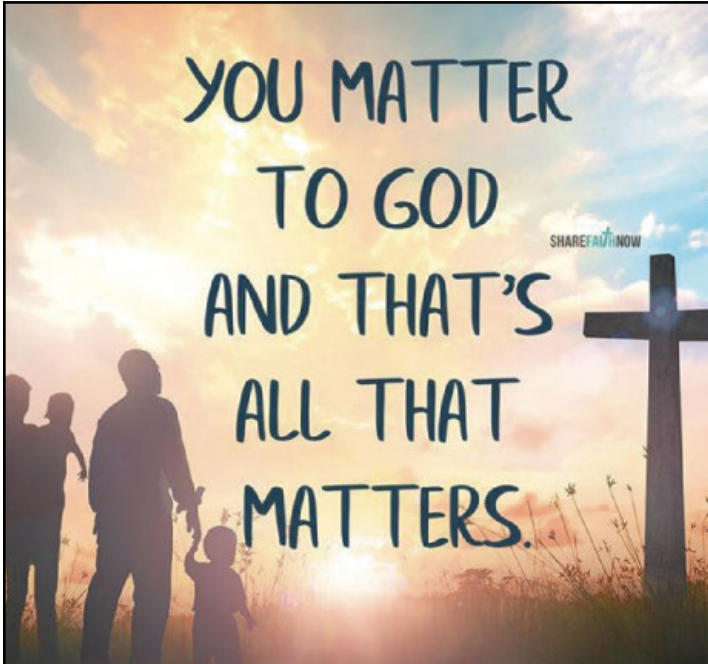

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION
28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

I confess that I have a soft spot for the scary things Jesus says because they are usually ignored. But there's gold in them thar hills if we have courage to look. This week, Jesus gives us a terrifying warning in his parable about the king who gives a marriage feast for his son and promptly goes berserk when people don't respond. The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. Scary indeed.

Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. A better view is this: to Jesus, your life matters. The universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. It is a theater of love offered and either accepted or rejected. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. It really does.

This should not only be sobering but exhilarating. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that he is inviting us; therefore our lives matter a great deal. There is a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. But how wonderful must the consequences of our 'yes' be?

The Wedding Garment

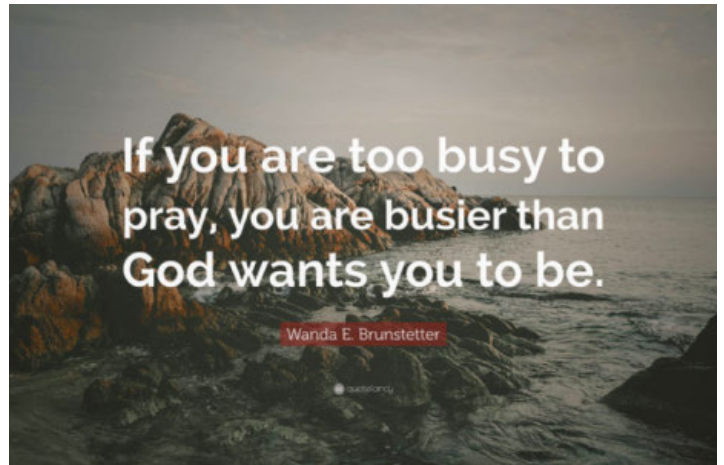

Time. It is our most precious asset. The time we spend with our family and friends (think of meals, tucking kids into bed, playing a game, chatting over coffee) is what creates the bond we have with them. PARISH KITCHENS USE AND SAFETY

Many different individuals and groups volunteer and use St. Charles' kitchens; those collecting items for or serving a meal program, a funeral meal, a reception, the men's group, school programs, the Parish festival or simply storing items in the cooler and more. If you're one of the group leaders, you were recommended to have orientation to that kitchen use. There is a binder in the Borromeo Room kitchen with some of the guidelines and equipment use as well as a checklist to be filled out at the end of events. The checklist is there as a reminder of safety issues. Please notify Vickie Flask through the office at 262-367-0800 if you would like a review or have questions.

We want everyone to be safe and keep things working in proper order, including for the next group using the kitchen. With your cooperation, the kitchens will continue to be available for parish activities.

Recent Safety Concerns/Reminders:

- Be sure the stove gas is turned completely off.
- If a GFCI outlet is tripped, notify the office.
- Close the freezer door tight. It's been left open a number of times resulting in ice build-up.
- Be sure to label, with name and date, items left in the cooler/freezer. Leave nothing on the floor.
- Clean the kitchen before you leave, especially things you've used. Clean up any spills and keep the floor tidy.
- Turn off the lights when you leave; that includes lights in the cooler/freezer.
- If you prop open any outside doors, be sure to close them.
- Lock the exterior building doors before you leave.

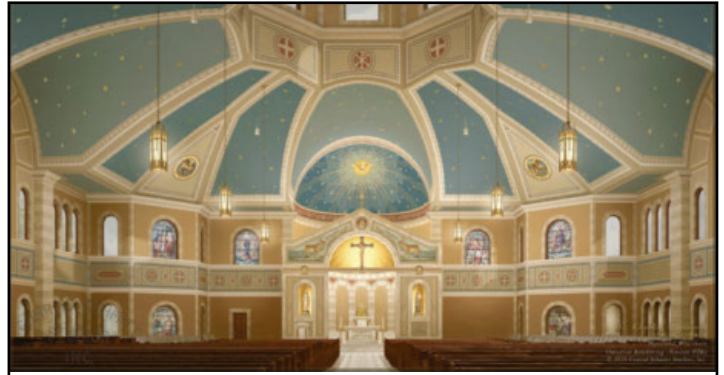



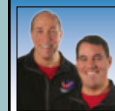
